A new General obligation Bond of 257 million is to be voted on by the voters with bond commission approval.

More revenue and general obligation bond debt is headed for Bond Commission approval. No luck getting reduction in Consent Decree agreement on projects completion date.

Our only hope for less debt lies with a ten year denial by the bond commission for more revenue bond debt issued.

The proposition is considered a <u>new</u> parishwide tax. If the proposition is passed, the following similar taxes will no longer be levied:

- 3.33 mills tax levied by the Haynesville School District No. 11, authorized by an election December 6, 2014, to be levied through 2026 for maintaining and operating school houses or buildings and other school related facilities.
- 11.96 mills tax levied by the Homer School District No. 13, authorized by an election held on March 26, 2022, to be levied through 2032 for acquiring, constructing, improving, maintaining, operating and supporting public school facilities, including equipment therefor.
- 9.25 mills tax levied by the Summerfield and Eastern Pineview Consolidated School District, authorized by an election held on May 9, 2020, to be levied through 2029 for constructing, improving, maintaining and operating buildings and related facilities and acquiring equipment and furnishings.
